# **Positive Outcomes for Kentucky Youth After Substance Abuse Treatment**

ADOLESCENT KENTUCKY TREATMENT OUTCOME STUDY FACT SHEET | 2022

AKTOS examines treatment outcomes for youth (ages 12-17) who receive publicly funded substance abuse treatment in Community Mental Health Centers in Kentucky. Results for this study included data on 52 adolescent clients who attended publicly-funded substance abuse treatment programs in Kentucky in FY 2019 and FY 2020 and then completed a follow-up survey approximately 12 months later in FY 2020 and FY 2021 (an average of 355.3 days).
